

2001 Christmas Bird Count -- Green Bay

67 species and 22,659 total birds

Dear Area Coordinators:

2001 CBC with 67 species set a record for the highest CBC we have ever had. The total individuals of 22,659 was above the average for the last 10 years. All field parties saw Mourning Doves, Starlings, Goldfinches and House Sparrows. The next most common birds seen by almost all parties were: RT Hawks, Herring Gulls, Rock Doves, Downy WP, B. Jays, Crows, BC Chickadees, WB Nuthatches, Juncos, and Cardinals.

Unusual birds include: Tundra Swan, E. Bluebirds, Y-rumped Warbler, Northern Shoveler, Redhead, Bufflehead, Hooded Merganser, N. Harrier, Ruffed Grouse, Snowy Owl, Belted Kingfisher, Pileated Woodpecker, Brown Creeper, Longspur, Peregrine Falcons, Merlin, Sharp-shinned Hawk, and Pine Grosbeak.

As usual, we missed some birds that are probably here but in very low numbers or were just absent: Pheasant, Gray Partridge, and Pine Siskin. Weather was very mild before and on count day but many counters and feeder people reported few birds sighted. Lots of open water because of very mild temps. And no snow cover.
