Dear Area Coordinators and Feeder Counters:

61 species and 18,284 Total birds

This year was a very good count for the number of species and total numbers. See the next page for a complete list of all birds seen on the 2009 count and the last 5 years of GB-CBCs. The number of parties, people in the field, total hours and total miles were similar to most years. The number of feeder watchers was up slightly.

Weather was very winter-like during most of December, starting with the blizzard on the 8-9th. The ground was snow covered and most water was frozen. Most groups saw at least one bird species that no other group saw. Most of us had 15-25 species. Although the Baumanns had 40 species, Jim & Bob Johnson/Mike Gottfredsen topped the list with 43, Ed Houston/Larry Schroepfer had 34, Don VanDuyse had 30 (with 8 Screech Owls- he started at midnight), Bob Mead had 29.

Rare birds seen on count day were: Tufted Titmouse, Bohemian Waxwing, and White Pelican. Wood duck, N Shoveler, Hooded Merganser, Coot, Red-headed WP, Northern Flicker, Pileated WP, Brown Creeper, Peregrine Falcon, and Horned Larks were all good sightings. Although Robins are regularly recorded on the CBC, numbers were up this year, they were seen by 7 different field parties. Numbers for Canada Geese were low again for the 3rd straight year, they were usually our most numerous bird reported. Probably the lack of open water and deep snow cover have moved many of them out of our area. Mallard numbers are still high. Turkeys are now very numerous. Four fewer Bald Eagles than last 2 years. Lower number of Red-tailed Hawks is probably due to weather. Crow numbers have recovered.
